- The National Resource Sharing Centre (NRSC) is the operational arm of AFAC
- Operates on behalf of the Commissioners and Chief Officers Strategic Committee (CCOSC)
- NRSC formed in 2016
- NRSC is responsible for coordinating resourcesharing for interstate and NZ
- Coordinates North American Continent (US and CAN) wildfire deployments
- First international deployment in 2000. Australia sent 96 people to the US
